



Community Group Frequently Asked Questions

Community Groups are the best way to get connected and grow spiritually.

Community Groups are groups of 10 to 20 people who meet in homes each week to connect over a shared meal and to learn about Jesus together through sermon-based discussion.

1. When do Community Groups meet? We currently have groups that meet on nights at various times in the evening. Our group days and times change each semester. You can find out about current groups at the Welcome Table or by emailing dennerachel@gmail.com.

2. How long do groups usually last? Groups run about 1.5 to 2 hours each week. Each group shares a meal for about 30 minutes and then discusses the sermon together for about 1 hour. Groups meet 16 weeks in the fall and spring. We switch things up a bit in the summer.

3. Why should I participate in a Community Group? The primary reason to participate in Community Group is that it is the best place to learn about what it means to believe in and follow Jesus. Community Groups are also a great place to connect with other people on the journey.

4. Am I expected to talk or contribute to the meal? Guests and newcomers are not expected to talk in discussion or contribute to the meal until they are ready. Regular participants are asked to contribute one item to the meal each week. Participants can talk in discussion as much or as little as they would like.

5. What if I have a transportation issue or time conflict? Our schedules don't always work out the way we'd like and that's ok. If you need to come late or leave early you're more than welcome to do that. Group members who don't have transportation are encouraged to car pool with other members of the group.

6. How do I get involved? To get involved in a Community Group select the "Community Group" option on the back of your Communication Card. A leader will contact you soon. You can also sign up at the Welcome Table before or after service.
